Alumni Association Young Alumni Achievement Award



2023 President's Distinguished Alumni Award Regina Black Lennox '77

The President's Distinguished Alumni Award is reserved for a graduate who exemplifies the characteristics of leadership, dedication to Catholic Franciscan values, and has made a longstanding commitment to Neumann University. Regina Black Lennox epitomizes that description and brings enduring honor to the university with her continued support of Neumann and her professional track record. Regina is a life-long educator, former teacher, administrator, and consultant dedicated to improving the life of children and building awareness and action around corporate social responsibility. Regina currently serves as Executive Vice President & Chief of

Staff, Satell Institute, a collective force of purpose-driven companies, and prior to that served almost twenty years at the Progressive Business Publications as the Director of Philanthropy & Corporate Citizenship. She is an advisory board member at the Museum of the American Revolution, a board member at the American Technion Association and is active with the organization, Girl Scouts of the USA. Regina has been awarded The Distinguished Advocate Award by The Support Center for Child Advocates, the Girl Scouts Juliet Light Award, and the Neumann University Alumni Association Recognition Award.

Sr. Clare Andrew D'Auria received her bachelor's in English at Neumann University in 1972. 2023 Alumni Association Recognition Award Gabriel Angemi '16



2023 Honorary Alumni Award John C. Ford


John Ford refers to himself as a "walking history book" for Neumann University. This is certainly a suitable title for a man with his long history with the University. John has served on the Board of Trustees for more than 40 years and served as board chair for two terms. He has served as a chair of the Development Committee and has participated in the growth of Neumann University from a burgeoning commuter college to a thriving residential university. John with his wife, Sandra, has also funded the John C. Ford Academic Resource Center, a dance studio in the Mirenda Center and scholarships for students with a particular interest in visual communications.



John is founder and principal of John C. Ford Associates, a consulting firm that specializes in management, leadership, sales, and organizational communications. His impressive corporate career included senior level positions in broadcasting (CBS, ABC, and the Home Box Office division of Time Warner) and in financial services (the American Stock Exchange and Merrill Lynch & Co.). He sits on numerous committees in academe, the arts and community affairs. John is recipient of the 2015 Neumann University Presidential Humanitarian Award and the University of Maryland Leadership Award. To honor John's contributions, the university dedicated the John C. Ford Student Success Center in spring of 2022.

2023 The Spirit of Francis and Clare of Assisi Award Patricia Demiranda '14

Patricia is co-founder of the William Trippley Youth Development Foundation (WTYDF), created to honor the memory of her son, William Trippley. The Trippley foundation offers at-risk youth a year-round program focusing on education and soccer. Patricia advocates for legistation like the Safer Pennsylvania Act, which aims to increase resources and support for crime victims and improve incarcerated people's access to rehabilitation to reduce recidivism and has devoted her life to improving communities and families.



Patricia is also the founder of Camp Encouragement, a grief camp for children who lost loved ones. This week-long camp allows children to participate in counseling sessions, talk about their loved ones, and meet other children going through the same or similar issues. Patricia is a trustee of the Media Providence Friends school, serves on the Chester Community Coalition, and was instrumental in the planning and creation of the STEMS playground at Showalter in Chester.

Patricia received her bachelor's degree in accounting from Virginia State College and earned a master's degree in organizational and strategic leadership from Neumann University.

2023 Young Alumni Achievement Award Dontae Timothy Phillips '10

Dontae Phillips is currently assigned to the Joint Staff at National Guard Bureau in Arlington, Virginia as a commissioned officer for Exceptional Family Member Program actions, issues, and initiatives and previously served as a chaplain (captain) for the department of defense.



Humbly he tells, "I learned of the rich heritage of the Sisters of Saint Francis of Philadelphia through my one-on-one interactions with the sisters and community service projects in the surrounding areas. Through community service and commitment, I forged lasting memories in attending spiritual retreats, feeding the homeless, and growing through my spiritual walk and journey while away from home."

Some of the awards he has been bestowed include the Aaron E. Gast Award in Urban Ministry 2016, an ESF Top Performer Award 2011, the Ichiban Award, and the Mary Francis Bachmann Award. Dontae's military decorations and awards include: the National Defense Service Medal, Army Service Ribbon, the Armed Forces Service Medal in response to COVID-19, and the Maryland Emergency Service Ribbon.

Dontae has a degree in political science from Neumann University, a master's degree in public administration from Villanova, a master's degree in divinity from Princeton's Theological Seminary and is currently pursuing a doctorate in philosophy from the University of Maryland.

2023 Volunteer of the Uear Award Courtney Curcio '18

Courtney Curcio graduated from Neumann in 2018 with a bachelor's degree in sport management. Courtney currently serves as the foundation director of the non-profit Professional Golfers Association (PGA) Philadelphia Reach. She developed relationships while she was a student that not only helped her in her professional career but strengthened her appreciation of giving back to Neumann to advance the sport management program and inspire service in fellow and future students. Without pause since graduation, Courtney lends her



enthusiasm to the creation of a sport management affinity group, educates Neumann students as a guest speaker, volunteers in many roles for the university's annual fundraising golf event and is a tireless advocate for the value of a Neumann education.

2023 School of Arts and Sciences Distinguished Alumni Dr. Kevin Copeland '00

Dr. Kevin Copeland began his studies in radiologic technology, after which, he obtained a Bachelor of Science degree at Neumann University in December of 2000 where he graduated with honors. Dr. Copeland then went on to attend medical school at the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine. His postgraduate training in internal medicine took place at Christiana Care Health Systems Program where he was nominated to serve as the Chief Resident for the Medicine Program at Christiana Care Health Systems. He began his fellowship in cardiology the following year and was elected the Chief Cardiology Fellow from July 2012 - June 2013. After completing his fellowship in cardiology, he continued an additional year of fellowship with a concentration in interventional cardiology.



Dr. Copeland has presented and published several abstracts and manuscripts in both general and interventional cardiology. He has a strong interest in interventional cardiology, and in the treatment of aortic stenosis with transcatheter aortic valve replacement.

Dr. Copeland is Board Certified in general and interventional cardiology from the American Board of Internal Medicine. He is also a fellow of the American College of Cardiology. Dr. Copeland has been a member of Cardiology Physicians, P.A. since July of 2014.

Dr. Copeland was awarded Physician Ambassador for the Cardiovascular Critical Care Unit and Nurse Physician Partner for both 2012 and 2013. In 2019, Dr. Copeland was recognized in *Delaware Today* as one of Delaware's Top Doctors.
