The Embrace of Radical Poverty: Clare of Assisi's Unconventional Response to a World of Violence

Clare of Assisi lived in a world full of violence. She encountered violence within the dynamic of her own family, her hometown of Assisi was at war with neighboring cities, the papacy was in violent conflict with the Holy Roman emperor, and Christendom itself was engaged in the violent throws of the crusades. This lecture will examine Clare's response to this world of violence by focusing on key episodes in her life: Clare's peaceful resistance to her family's violent opposition to her adoption of a Franciscan lifestyle, her heroic role in the defense of Assisi as the city faced attack by enemy forces, and her insistence on embracing a simple life of absolute poverty in spite of papal opposition to her attempts to do so. Conclusions will be drawn as to the transformation Clare experienced through her encounters with violence as well as the insights Clare might offer regarding an appropriate Christian response to the violence of our own world.
