Congratulations! You have applied for graduation and are scheduled to graduate at our annual commencement exercises. I must remind you, however, that if you are still taking classes, your graduation is dependent upon successful completion of your semester coursework and fulfillment of all requirements for the degree. <u>Only students who have completed **all** degree requirements are permitted to walk in our annual commencement exercises</u>. IMPORTANT TO PICK UP CAP AND GOWN AND RECEIVE DIPLOMA

In addition to satisfying all degree requirements you must complete the following items <u>on or before April</u> <u>21st 2018</u> in order to pick up your cap and gown and receive the diploma:

- Pay all outstanding fees to the Business Office and the Library. You can visit WebAdvisor to check your balance due.
- Complete an exit interview <u>www.studentloans.gov</u> if you have *ever* received Federal Direct Student Loans or NSL Nursing Loans
- Complete First-Destination Survey. The link to the survey will be available on April 12th. Go to https://www.neumann.edu/career-development to access the link.

CAP AND GOWN DISTRIBUTION

Cap and Gown Pick-up and the Class of 2018 Mixer will be held on April 23rd from 4:00 PM to 7:00 PM in the Bruder Life Center Gym and Patio. Graduates DO NOT need to order or be measured ahead of time. When you arrive for pick-up, you will be given your academic attire that matches your height and degree.

The cost of your academic attire is part of the \$100 graduation fee. Graduates will keep all academic attire at the conclusion of the ceremony.

Graduates who cannot attend the Cap and Gown Pick-up will be able to pick up their cap, gown and tickets in the University Campus Store between April 24th and May 11th.

BACCALAUREATE MASS

Our Baccalaureate Mass will be held in The Mirenda Center for Sport, Spirituality and Character Development. All Graduates are encouraged to attend with their families. Tickets are not required for the Mass and seating will be on a first come, first served basis. Elderly or handicapped persons may be dropped off at the side entrance of the Mirenda Center <u>before</u> 6:30 p.m. for the Baccalaureate Mass.

GRADUATION/COMMENCEMENT

Saturday, May 12, 2018

 <u>10:00 a.m.</u> Doctoral, Master's and Continuing Adult & Professional Studies Graduation Commencement for Doctoral, Master's and Continuing Adult and Professional Studies will begin at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, May 12th in The Mirenda Center for Sport, Spirituality and Character Development. Lineup will begin at 9:00 a.m. in Community Hall of the Mirenda Center. Academic attire will be worn - cap, gown, and tassel. Hoods will be draped over your right arm. The Dean or Division Representative will hood each graduate before receiving the diploma.

2. <u>3:00 p.m.</u> Undergraduate Graduation

Commencement for **Undergraduates** will begin at 3:00 p.m. on Saturday, May 12th in the Mirenda Center for Sport, Spirituality and Character Development. Line-up will begin at 2:00 p.m. in Community Hall of the Mirenda Center. Academic Attire will be worn – cap, gown, tassel and hoods

ADMISSION TICKETS

The number of guest tickets for each graduate is determined by the number of graduating students along with the maximum number of seats provided. Each Graduate will receive **4 tickets** and will be distributed when you pick up your cap and gown on April 23rd. Any guest entering The Mirenda Center, including children, will need a ticket. There are no exceptions to this policy. Anyone who attempts to attend the ceremonies without a ticket will be denied entrance to The Mirenda Center.

Ticket Policy

The sale of unused commencement tickets and any fraudulent activity related to tickets is strictly prohibited. However, if you have tickets you know you are not going to use please <u>give</u> them to one of your friends who may need them. If there are additional tickets the process for obtaining them will be emailed by April 1, 2018.

Anyone found to be selling or purchasing unused commencement tickets could face academic discipline including the loss of the privilege to participate in their commencement ceremony. The tickets are university property, therefore each ticket is a "revocable license" which the university can withdrawal at any time at its sole discretion.

COMMENCEMENT LIVE STREAM

A live stream of each ceremony will be added to the Neumann University webpage one hour prior to the start of each ceremony to accommodate those family members/friends who are unable to attend. Additionally, all ceremonies will be recorded and available to view/download for free approximately 1-2 weeks after the ceremonies.

PARKING

Please advise guests that parking is available in the Life Center parking lot and the Living and Learning Center student lot. Shuttle service will be available from the Rocco A. Abessinio Building parking lot to The Mirenda Center. Carpooling is suggested because of the number of guests expected to attend.

ACCESSABLE SEATING

Some seating is available for guests in wheelchairs or with limited mobility, with one companion seat. Tickets are also required for this special seating. If a guest requires special seating, send an email request with an explanation of the need (wheelchair, minimal steps, etc.) by April 15th to Mr. Lee Strofe at strofel@neumann.edu.

Elderly or handicapped persons may be dropped at the side entrance of the Mirenda Center <u>before</u> 9:30 a.m. for the 1^{st} ceremony and by 2:30 p.m. for the 2^{nd} ceremony.

GRADUATION HONORS

Graduation Honors at Commencement, are reserved for first-time baccalaureate students who have successfully completed a minimum of **60** credits <u>at</u> Neumann University (excluding all accepted transfer credits and documented prior learning) and have a cumulative GPA of 3.50 or higher. Honors cannot be officially determined until after May 11th, when all grades have been processed.
