Senator Pat Toomey (Pennsylvania) is a common-sense leader on economic, financial services, and budget issues.

He helped write and enact the bipartisan JOBS Act, which cuts regulatory burdens on small and medium-sized businesses making it easier for them to raise capital and create jobs.

Senator Toomey is also an active member of Congressional Task Force on Alzheimer’s- a bicameral group of legislators that works to advance research and awareness of Alzheimer’s disease in Congress. He also serves on the bipartisan VA Backlog Working Group, which has worked to reduce the backlog of disability claims within the VA head on.

Senator Toomey previously was elected to the House of Representatives where he served three terms. In addition to his public service, the senator owned and operated a small restaurant chain in the Lehigh Valley and founded a community bank.
